Located off Hwy 33, just 3 miles east of Hwy 48, only 30 minutes west of Tulsa.

The main park trails, located at Sheppard's Point and in the old Rocky Point area, are approximately 4.8 miles and are easy and fun to ride. Mostly wooded trails with some open areas. Parking is offered at the Day Lot next to the gate house with water for the horses and at the Overflow Lot which is to the right as you pull into the park. Pay boxes are located at both lots. Although there are rocks here and there, shoes are not required.

The trails west of the Bowtie into the WMA consist of a series of loops that are easy to ride, run through the woods and on open meadows. With approximately 5 plus miles of finished trail, you enter this area when you pass through the WMA gate west of the Bowtie sign in the park. There are also another 5 to 6 miles of trails under constructions with access along 141st St. riding west from Hog Hollow.

The Rattle Snake Trail starts across the road from the Rocky Point area and goes north into the WMA. The main trail runs north to the Water Fall next to Hwy 33. The main trail is approximately 9 miles out and back, is easy with woods, open areas and lake views. There are several creek/gully crossings that can be challenging for beginners. The new Friendship Loops are easy, run along the Rattle Snake leaving and returning to the main trail. Armadillo Speedway and Armadillo Speedway II run west of Rattle Snake and can be a little more challenging. More loops along Rattle Snake are planned for the future.

Main park trails are open year round but the WMA trails are closed for hunting from October 1 thru January 15, April 6 thru May 6, and the weekend before April 6 for Youth Turkey season.

Trail colors (can lids) in the park:
Yellow - North Trail, Chigger and Pick-A-Tick Pass.
Red - Lakeside, Boot Hill and Skull Trail.
Orange - connecting trails.
Green – short cuts/detours.

Trail colors (can lids) west of the Bowtie:
White - Deer Run, Birch Tree Loop.
Yellow - Birch Tree 2.
Blue - Lost Pond Trail.
Orange – Trails West (connecting trails), Hog Hollow, Mosquito Creek Loop.
Red – Wild Turkey Trail.
Green – short cuts/detours.

Trail colors (can lids) on Rattle Snake:

Blue - main out and back trail.

Yellow & ribbons – Friendship Loops and trails on the east side of main the main trail.

Red & ribbons – Armadillo Speedway, Armadillo Speedway II on the west side of the main trail.

Not all trails are marked with colored can lids yet but the colors listed are what are planned. There may be ribbons in different areas as the trails are still under development. Ribbons may be any color.

Check the map box for future updates.
